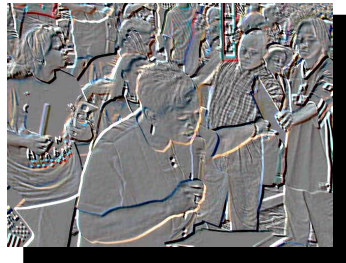

- Immediate Congressional action to return federal parole

- Presidential leadership supporting prisoner re-entry reform and restoration of voting rights
- Abolish Three Strikes Laws
- Crime prevention policies that are founded on science and compassion, not rhetoric
- Amnesty for tens of thousands of eligible, nonviolent drug war prisoners
- Agreement to document, expose and eliminate all torture in prisons and jails
- Abolish the Death Penalty
- End juveniles being tried and imprisoned as adults
- Unified White House and Congressional leadership in developing large public works programs to rebuild blighted urban neighborhoods, providing real employment and educational opportunities
- Reversing the growth of the multi-billion dollar prison-industrial complex

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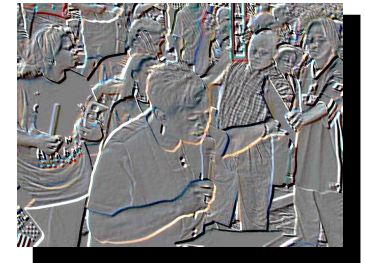


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
